Through food distribution drives in Sectors 48 and 70, warm meals reached children, elderly residents, and daily wage workers. A community food bhandara brought people together over shared meals, while cloth distribution and collection drives helped families stay warm and encouraged mindful, sustainable giving.



Our sanitary pad distribution drive ensured women had access to essential hygiene products, addressing a need that often goes unnoticed. At Civil Hospital, baby kits were distributed to new mothers, offering comfort and support at the very start of life's journey.

Together, these initiatives reflect what December stood for at Snehdhara - showing up, listening, and caring deeply. Because change doesn't always come from grand gestures, but from consistent acts of kindness, shared with purpose.

# Baby Kit Distribution Drive Civil Hospital



The arrival of a newborn should be a moment of hope, not worry. In December, Snehdhara conducted a Baby Kit Distribution Drive at Civil Hospital, supporting new mothers and their families during a vulnerable phase of life. Each kit contained essential items to help care for newborns and ease immediate financial stress.



By reaching mothers at the very start of their journey, we aimed to offer comfort, reassurance, and dignity. This drive reminded us that timely support can make a meaningful difference especially when families need it the most.

# Food Distribution Drives Sector 48 & Sector 70

# Cloth Distribution Drive Sector 48

Each garment restored warmth and dignity, helping families face winter with a little more comfort. The drive also encouraged mindful giving, turning excess into support for those in need.

# Collection Drive Uppal Southend



Sustainability and compassion came together during our collection drive at Uppal Southend. Residents donated clothes and usable items they no longer needed, allowing Snehdhara to channel these resources to underserved communities.

# Sanitary Pad Distribution Drive Sector 48 & 70



Menstrual hygiene is essential for health and dignity. In December, Snehdhara conducted a sanitary pad distribution drive across Sectors 48 and 70, reaching women who lack regular access to hygiene products.



The drive focused on normalising conversations around periods while meeting an immediate need. By ensuring access to basic care, we took another step toward empowering women with confidence and comfort.
